This folder \AIHA\Registry ...contains information from our effort to develop a cancer registry in Kazakhstan that would be compatible with WHO and CDC standards. Sara Rozin worked with our cancer registrar (Pat Tesch) from TMH and Tom Wheeler (pathologist) and Yuri Prugalov sp? from Semey. We had help also from the Commission on Cancer, North American Association of Central Cancer Registries (NAACCR), College of Surgeons and many others. It was developed in a bilingual format so we and they could look at the same fields in our preferred language. This was developed after we learned on our initial trip that the data in their version of a cancer registry no longer contained individuals who had died of cancer...? Why? Because they deleted those who died due to a lack of storage space on their computer and disks. Obviously this was a problem and thus we began a binational partnership to create a new registry program to rectify this.
